Private security and human rights

The private security sector operates in widely varied and often complex environments with frequent human rights risks. These issues extend to companies in other sectors which require private security services. In addition, private security's core operations often involve the protection of human rights such as the right to life, security of the person and property, even if not expressed in human rights terms.
